A Safe Place

Trinity Church seeks to provide a safe and secure environment for the children who participate in our church programs and activities. Nursery children are signed in and out by their parents. The other classes will meet their teachers in the Narthex after the Gloria and return to the Sanctuary before communion. Please leave your cell phones on vibrate in the event we need your presence upstairs.

Volunteers are trained in the Trinity Church Child Safety Policy. By implementing our Child Safety Practices, our goal is to protect the children of Trinity Church from harm, incidents of misconduct or inappropriate behavior while also protecting our staff and volunteers. This policy is available upon request.

In case of an emergency our team is trained to evacuate the building in a safe and orderly manner. Teachers and helpers will remain with the children until parents sign out each child. Parents will pick up their children at the outside yard on the southwest corner of the building on the corner of Peachy and Okanogan across from Colonial Vista.

Please do not go upstairs to find your children!

Sick Child Policy

It is our desire to provide a healthy and safe environment for all children at Trinity Church. Children with the following symptoms should NOT attend Sunday School:

Fever, diarrhea, or vomiting within the last 24 hours

Eve or skin infections

Other symptoms of communicable or infectious disease
If a child is observed to be ill, Trinity church workers will contact the
parent or guardian and have them pick up the child as soon as possible.

Medications Policy

Trinity church workers will not administer prescription or nonprescription medications to the children in their care. Medications should be administered by parents.

Exceptions to this medications policy may be granted to parents of children with potentially life-threatening conditions (such as asthma or severe allergic reactions). Parents of such children should address their situation with the Director of Children's Ministries and their child's specific teacher to develop a plan of action.

Food Allergies/Sensitivities

We do not serve snacks & drinks at this time.

Discipline Policy

The Trinity Church priority is keeping all children safe in class.

It is the policy of Trinity Church not to administer corporal punishment. Workers shall not spank, grab, hit or use any other physical discipline of children. Workers shall not use harsh words.

Rather, Trinity Church workers shall use a firm calm voice to address the child and may place their hand on the child's shoulder.

Children may be restrained if they are in danger of hurting themselves or others. If this is necessary parents will be contacted as soon as is possible.

Welcome to Children's Sunday School at Trinity Church!

We are thankful for the opportunity to walk with your children as they grow in Grace and Truth by the power of the Spirit and the Word. Each Sunday, during the 9:45 am service, participants continue the "liturgical dance" in their Sunday School rooms. Song, Scripture stories, art and prayer make up our weekly gatherings. Children return to the service after the sermon to join the congregation for Communion. Parents are most welcome to come and see what God is doing in our classes. We also love newcomers and visitors! Children can be registered online trinitywenatchee.org under Godly Play.

Biblical Curriculum:

All our storied Godly Play class scripts are taken from Scripture and come primarily from books by Sonja Stewart: *Young Children and Worship* and *Following Jesus*. What makes this curriculum unusual is the Montessori method in which they are taught – which works from the principle that children learn best by doing and playing. So – we 'play' the Bible stories. Using wooden figures and scripts with minimal words, the Scriptures come alive for the children who respond both through art and questions. The youth (5th grade and beyond) are taught in a fun and relational setting encouraging each other in their walk with Jesus.

Shaping their Biblical Imagination:

We are committed to telling Scripture to children in such a way that they can enter the stories deeply and personally. Our goal is not pat answers but an encounter with Christ. We find that this best happens when the story is told quietly and compellingly, followed by a series of questions where the children get to 'wonder' together. Questions we ask are: I wonder what was your favorite part of the story? I wonder what was the most important part? I wonder how you would feel if Jesus looked at you? (... and other story-specific questions). I wonder where you are in this story, or if something like this has happened to you? During this time, the children share deeply and relate their own lives to the story. Following this 'wondering' time, the children respond further through art or play – again, allowing the story to have its way with them in the deepest places in their lives and hearts.
